- > 2. These individuals created a XML application, the "Railway Markup
- > Language railML®". And example words with the prefix "railML®" are:
- > railML® scheme (GER: railML®-Schema), railML® partial scheme (GER:
- > railML®-Teilschema), railML® element (railML®-Element)

- > 3. Either "railML.org" or "railML®". No other combinations are allowed.

- > 4. All component schemes are part of THE railML® scheme. So we must
- > write: the railML® scheme (= sum of all partial schemes) or railML®
- > partial scheme "timetable" (or "rollingstock" or "infrastructure").
