RailML caught my interest when doing simulation of the dutch high-speed line (the only one in this muddy country for the time being ;) The raildata could be imported by RailML, really cool !

Since, the idea has caught on that RailML is a fine format for data-exchange between networkmanagers and suppliers for signalling, simulation, OCS... This will be a huge leap for mankind (or at least a few of 'm). Dutch ProRail is highly interested in the idea as a more efficient means of data exchange will become necessary in the foreseeable future; engineering ETCS by hand from scans of outdated maps would be a nightmare. Currently, we're in a project with ProRail to try and map their network onto RailML. The previous posting puts a finger on one of the things that were suboptimal.
