Hello,
the attribute 'type' of the 'entry' element could be either:
begin/end/pass/stop (in railML V1.1).

This is a mixture of two different meanings:

- stop/pass to indicate whether the train stops at this entry or passes this point
- begin/end at the first/last entry to indicate if this is only part of a longer train which is starting/ending somewhere else, or its begin/end

Usually an 'entry' is considered to be a station but not necessary.
Especially a passed entry could be any point along the track e.g. a blocking signal.

In the new version 2.0 the attribute will be renamed to 'ocpType' (former 'type') in 'ocpTT' (former 'entry'), but with the same meaning and characteristic.
