validating the Simple Example xml for railML v3.1 raised a list of errors:
elements called *Ref (like platformRef) are used but not allowed by the schema (the corresponding element is written w/o the Ref suffix) etcSignal (element of signal) should be etc conforming to the schema speedSignal (element of signal) is not allowed by the schema at all, although mentioned in the corresponding html documentation in the SVN [1] --> clash between xsd and UML model / documentation?
